Dear Colleagues:

This is the first newsletter from the Asian Pacific Society for Respirology, a new international society devoted to the promotion of knowledge of the respiratory system in health and disease, with particular emphasis on the situation in the Pacific and Asian region.

The first biennial meeting of the society is scheduled for October 21-24 in Tokyo. Most of you might have already seen our first and second circulars.

You may have noted that, because of the high cost of accomodations in Tokyo, we are offering subsidies to those from outside Japan whose abstracts are accepted for presentation. This is primarily aimed at making it possible for young, active investigators to have a chance to present their work for evaluation by their peers from Asian and Pacific countries.

We earnestly hope that many of you will come to our first meeting, hopefully accompanied by you colleagues, to help lay the founding stone of the society which should also mark the beginning of a new period in the history of the diagnosis and treatment of conditions affecting the respiratory system in the Asian and Pacific area.
